'UKFC SMART Approach'



Advice and guidance from the Government and the Football Association has required all clubs and camps to conduct a risk assessment for COVID-19. UK Football Camps have taken the 'SMART' approach for the safety of our players, parents and coaching team.

- **SENSIBLE** approaches made by UK Football Camps:
 - Players, Parents and Coaches know how everything is going to work.
- **MANAGING** the expectations of Coaches, Players and Parents:
 - An organised and planned approach to group football.
- **AWARENESS** of any changes in guidance from the FA or Government:
 - Any updates and changes to protocol are sent out to parents and coaches.
- **RESPECT** any coach, player or parents views and decisions:
 - Everyone is welcome to attend camp if they have NO signs of illness & are comfortable to do so.
- **TRACK** how things are working throughout:
 - Feedback and good communication from coaches, players and parents.

MATRIX



- The risk assessments below give both primary and residual risks.
- The primary risk is the risk associated with the identified hazard assuming that the risk associated, remains completely uncontrolled.
- The residual risk is the level of the remaining risk produced when proposed control measures have been applied.
- All club management committees shall ensure that the risk control measures are fully implemented to achieve these levels.
- The columns following the residual risk data indicate where additional controls may be required or where special attention should be given.
- For the avoidance of confusion - the columns of the risk rating sections are headed Likelihood, Severity.

Colour	Risk	Action
GREEN	LOW	Action is not required to lower the risk. Time Effort Money is proportionate to the risk.
AMBER	MEDIUM	Action may be required to control the risk. Immediate short-term measures may be required.
RED	HIGH	Action is required urgently to control the risk. Further resources are almost inevitable.

Hand Washing / Sanitising.	Hands not being sanitised prior to arrival at camp. No hand sanitiser available.	Players / Coaches / Parents / Staff	Increased rate of potential exposure & spread of COVID-19.	4 HIGH	Regular checks of sanitary facilities & hand sanitiser stock. Signage at venue where possible and regular routines in place.	3 LOW	COVID-19 Compliance Officer appointed and implementing regular daily routines.
First-Aid Procedure	Having to address a first aid situation	Players / Coaches	Designated first aider may have to come in to contact with injured person	4 HIGH	Players will clean wounds themselves wherever possible (First Aider to address the situation)	3 MEDIUM	First Aid gloves to be used and antibacterial wipes to hand. Face mask worn if necessary.

Drop Off and Collection Points (& during sessions)	Congested areas with parents parking together or congregating	Parents / Players / Coaches / Staff	Social distancing may not be kept	4 MEDIUM	Separate times and lines allocated for different groups (parents respect social distancing and wear face masks)	2 LOW	UKFC responsibility to ensure parents wear face masks and players abide by the rules set out on drop off and collection.
Areas Requiring Sanitary Cleaning Each Day of Camp	Equipment contamination Toilets, floor and other areas hygiene	Players / Coaches	Spread of Covid-19	4 MEDIUM	ALL equipment, toilets, floor and other areas used are to be wiped down with spray/wipes before, during & after EACH session.	2 LOW	Ensure all cleaning products are onsite Bleach & 70% alcohol cleaning wipes for specific areas.
Personal Belongings	Water Bottles & Bags etc being contaminated	Players / Coaches	Spread of Covid-19	3 MEDIUM	ALL personal belongings to be kept separately and only touched/moved by its owner.	2 LOW	Coach to implement designated safe areas around venue.




Risk Assessed...



- The control measures, indicated within the assessment, are reasonably practicable to control the risks identified based on the protocol.
- The findings of the risk assessment shall be communicated to those who may be exposed, or otherwise come into contact with the hazards and risks identified.
- Camp Management team must ensure that the control measures are implemented and managed.
- An ongoing review of the assessment will take place and amended if the guidance from the governing body or Government departments is updated and suggests that the last control measures suggested are no longer sufficient to control risks, or are inappropriate, or if additional hazards are identified.
- A process of continuous assessment and re-assessment will be undertaken to ensure appropriate risk controls in accordance with all Government and FA protocols.

This risk assessment has been carried out in order to identify the hazards and quantify the risks of these hazards exposing people to the virus. The control measures must be either physical or procedural and must be communicated to those who will work with, or otherwise come into contact with the hazards. In undertaking this risk assessment, information and advice has been gathered from the The Football Association and the Government along with other recognised sources. Hazards and risks cannot be eliminated and therefore must be controlled. Control measures have been considered appropriate to the current Government advice
