



Information for Parents

Pre-Camp

- UK Football Camps are happy to accommodate a child on another camp if he or she cannot participate on the one originally registered to. This is providing we have been given 7 working days written/email notice or if after this time due to ill health, a valid doctor's certificate is produced or at the discretion of UKFC management.
- Please see our full list of terms and conditions online at www.ukfootballcamps.co.uk.

The attendees at camp should have the following:

- A breakfast fuelled body, a packed lunch and plenty of non-fizzy drinks (unless specific sports drinks).
- Snacks for throughout the day – There will be an on-site Tuck Shop (payable locally). Please give £2-5 to your child!
- Appropriate wet weather clothing (inc spare clothes) and sun protection (if applicable).
- Appropriate footwear for both a wet and dry grass pitch surfaces or 3G/Astro/hard wearing trainers (if applicable).
- Shin pads should be worn for mini-World Cup matches and other football related games during the camp.

A fantastic attitude and good listening skills are essential...

During Camp

- Final payment (in cash) is required on the first day of your child's camp (excludes Christmas Special).
- For All UK Football Camps, normal hours are 09.30hrs – 15.30hrs (early/late club 8.30hrs – 16.30hrs +£5 per day).
- UKFC & it's associates take no responsibility for loss/damage of valuables brought onto the site (don't bring any!).



The following rules have been implemented for any parent who is 'invited' to come and watch a late afternoon session:

- Parents must remain in designated spectator area (during these sessions only - unless permitted to do otherwise).
- Parents that wish to use toilet facilities, please use an alternative location or ask a UKFC staff member at camp.
- No offensive, insulting, abusive language or behaviour. No swearing, alcohol or smoking is permitted at any time.
- Always respect all UKFC coaches decisions and if any parent has a query, please talk to the head coach at camp.
- Applaud effort and good play wherever possible.
- UK Football Camps if prompted and if it is felt necessary, can remove any participant or parent from the camp resulting in forfeiture of all registration fees paid...

Post-Camp

- At all UKFC camps, the head coach is responsible as to when it is safe for your child to go home each day.
- Only designated parents/guardians will be able to take their children home (ID may be requested).

Remember that children play for FUN.

Let the FA qualified coaches do their jobs.

Encourage players to respect each other and the coaching staff.

Never criticise a player for making a mistake – this is a part of learning.
